STUDENT MENTORSHIP PROGRAMME

"Mentoring is a brain to pick, an ear to listen, and a push in the right direction".

The Student Mentor Program is launched in our college to provide a platform for mentees to realize their potential by enabling personal and professional relationships with mentors, who act as role models and provide guidance to them. It offers opportunities to develop business contacts, access industry information and gain valuable insights from experienced and successful professionals.

The goal of student mentoring is to help students involved in the mentoring program to gain the skills and confidence to be responsible for their own futures. The Student Mentor Program is run by participation of faculty members of the college.

THE ROLES OF FACULTY MENTORS

- 1. Meet 20 students each week and assist them in planning and also help them later as per the need raised by the Students.
- 2. Address the issues, such as home-sickness, depression, time management etc.
- 3. Develop a cordial environment for the students and make possible a smooth transition of life in the college campus.
- 4. Provide feedback to the management on matters that are affecting the students.
- 5. Continually assess the student issues and plan appropriate programs and activities for their welfare.
- 6. Document all inappropriate behaviors of 20 students and consult the Principal on the disciplinary issues about them.
- 7. Meet students who are facing difficulties, whenever needed.
- Plan activities throughout the year for the 20 students to get them involved in the college. The activities should focus on various aspects of life in the campus, including time management, communication and team work.
- 9. Mentor meeting should be conducted on the third day after the completion of the internal exams.
- 10. Parents, Mentor meeting should be conducted in every semester.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. College transport is compulsory to all the students(except hostel students)
- 2. Students should be polite, dignified, neat, and obedient and speak in English only.
- 3. Students are expected to be in the lecture hall five minutes earlier the commencement of class and must maintain discipline and silence inside the lecture hall, drawing hall, labs, and workshops while commuting.
- 4. Student's movement outside the classroom during class hours is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Students are instructed not to carry any valuable items to college.
- 6. Possession/Usage of MOBILE, WALKMAN, IPOD, CAMERA or any other Electronic items are not allowed in the college campus, hostel and college transport. If found, the same will be seized & will not be returned. The student will be suspended immediately, upon enquiry with a penalty of Rs.10,000/-
- 6. Students should not change their seating arrangement. Once a student occupies a particular seat they have to maintain the same till the end of the year. He/ She is responsible for scribbling on the desks or any damage.
- 7. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a disciplined manner whenever they represent themselves outside the campus.
- 8. Smoking / chewing bubble gum / consuming drugs / tobacco products/ alcohol are strictly prohibited.
- 9. Celebrations of any kind without prior permission from the management are strictly prohibited.
- 10. Students should wear their own lab coats and carry their observation note books for their lab classes. They should not leave the lab without completing their experiments.
- 11. Periodical reports will be sent to Parents / Guardians calling their attention regarding the student's attendance, progress and conduct. Parents are expected to contact PRINCIPAL /HoD for discussion regarding the same.
- 12. Students those who fail in the regular internal tests have to attend special coaching classes. For special coaching classes transportation will not be provided.
- 13. Change of address to be informed to the respective counselors/ class in-charge by the parent or guardian with proof, to update the office records.
- 14. Students have to pay the arrear exam fees for all the subjects. If the students are not paying the arrear exam fees in time, late fee will be charged.
- 15. Students have to assemble in the exam hall before 10 minutes (Internal / External Exam)
- 16. No Due Norms:

All the students should clear all their no dues before the commencement of IA 2, MODEL Exam and Anna University Exams.

NORMS FOR ATTENDANCE

1. Student who comes late or absent themselves for any period in any of the sessions is treated as $\frac{1}{2}$ day absent.

2. Leave message over telephone/ e-mail/ fax/ telegram is not encouraged. (except for the valid reason)

3. For one day sick leave or leave for unforeseen circumstances, a leave letter signed by the Parent or Guardian or Warden must be enclosed along with a medical certificate and should be submitted to the Principal, when the student reports to the college. Such leave can be permitted only three times per semester. Parent/ Guardian should accompany if the above condition is violated.

4. For the leave which extends to 2 days continuously, the leave letter signed by Parent or Guardian or Warden enclosed with a medical certificate (if sick) should reach the Principal through a messenger and the Parent may confirm the same through phone.

5. If a student is absent for 3 cumulative days or now and then in that semester without prior permission, their Parents have to meet the Principal. Only then the student will be allowed inside the classroom. If absenteeism continues for more than 5 days, the name will be taken out from the register. A fee of Rs.500/- has to be paid for re-admission. If this is repeated then the issue will be dealt with seriously.

6. For any family function or other medical ground, Parents must come with a reasonable proof in person and avail the leave.

7. Students who fail to report on the re-opening day, or after long holidays, should pay a readmission fee of Rs.500/-. Leave message will not be accepted.

8. Students can take two days on duty (O.D) per semester with prior permission from the Principal.

DRESS CODE

- 1. Students must wear their Identity Card (ID) inside the campus and in the college bus.
- 2. Students who avail college transport facility must carry the transport ID with them.
- 3. Students who are found without the College ID will have to pay a fine of Rs.50 /- on the spot.
- 4. If the ID card is lost, it is the responsibility of the student to contact the office and collect the new ID card within a week after paying an amount of Rs.100/-.
- 5. Duplicate Hall Ticket can be obtained with the payment of Rs 50/-
- 6. All the students should dressed neatly. Boys should wear formal clothing with tucked in shirts, with formal shoes. No Jeans / Cotton jeans / T-Shirts permitted.
- 7. Girls should wear only salwar / chudithars with neatly pinned duppatas to the college. Saree

with blazers will be permitted only during the college functions. (wearing tight fittings, short kurthas, tight pants, thin or flimsy / transparent dresses are strictly prohibited).

- 8. Students are expected to wear blazers for all the college functions and whenever required.
- 9. Casual clothing is strictly prohibited in campus.
- 10. Students who are not adhering to the dress code will be sent home immediately.
- 11. Students shall not enter the college in inebriated conditions, failing which they will be removed from the college and they will not be allowed inside the college campus.

COMPLAINT ADDRESSING AND REDRESSAL SYSTEM

Velammal I Tech has a complaint addressing system to register the complaints from students, parents, visitors and vendors. MEMBERSHIP IN OTHER LIBRARIES

Our college library has membership in IIT Madras Library, British Council Library, American Resource Centre and Anna University, Chennai.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Silence should be maintained in the library.
- Students can obtain membership cards from the library by producing their identity cards. Library cards are not transferable.
- Only one book can be borrowed on each card. Members are responsible for the books borrowed on their cards. Loss of books must be immediately reported to the librarian in writing and the member should either replace the book with a new copy or twice its original rate must be paid along with the overdue charges.
- Students should produce their Identity Card along with the library card at the time of borrowing books.
- Students should return all the library books on the last day of the university exam of each semester. Otherwise, they have to pay overdue charge of Rs.100/- for each book.
- Absence will not be taken as a reason for the delay in returning the book.
- An overdue charge of Rs.1/- per day and Rs.2/- from the third week onwards will be levied.
- If a book is not returned within 28 days from the date of issue, students will not be allowed to attend the class.
- Duplicate cards will be issued on payment of Rs.100/- for each card. All members should sign the entry register at the entrance of the library as a token of their acceptance to adhere the rules of the same.
- Students are prohibited from taking their private belongings inside the library hall.
- Books should be dealt with proper care. No damage or marking should be made.
- Students can keep a book for a week from the date of issue. One renewal is permitted in case there is no demand for that book. Reference books and copies of university examination question papers are not lent.
- Members on receiving books shall examine them before they leave the library and report to the librarian, if any damage is noticed.
- The librarian may recall any book at any time even at the time period of loan is not expired.
- Members can reserve books and check them periodically. The reserved books will be kept in the library for two days; if the student fails to approach the librarian then the book will be issued to the next person.

HOSTEL

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR HOSTEL RESIDENTS

Students who wish to stay in the hostel should apply in the prescribed application form and adhere to the following rules :

- Students should occupy only the room allotted by the Warden/ Deputy Warden.
- Students are advised to take care of their valuables kept in the rooms. The College authorities will not be responsible for any loss of cash/ valuables.
- Students are responsible for cleanliness of their rooms.
- Students are instructed not to keep jewellery, camera, mobile phone or any other costly items inside the hostel room.
- Celebrations of any kind without prior permission from the management are strictly prohibited.
- Students are not permitted to stay in the hostel during college working hours without specific permission from the Warden or Deputy Warden.
- Parents are requested to give a list of authorized visitors/local guardians with photographs who alone will be permitted to visit the students in the hostel, and to do other formalities in the absence of parents.
- Students can entertain the visitors on the Working days - 4.30 pm to 6.00 pm Holidays - 11.00 am to 6.00 pm
- Guests / Visitors / Local Guardians are not permitted to enter / stay in the hostel.
- Day scholars are not allowed to visit the hostel on any account.
- Students will be permitted to go home during holidays only after getting permission from the Principal and the Warden.
- Students who have to go home during working days due to sickness or unforeseen circumstances or function or ceremonies, must get prior permission from the Principal or Warden with the requisition from Parents in person or through letter. The presence of local guardian is necessary in the absence of the parents.
- Inmates going out should come back to the hostel by 6.30 pm, If they fail will be fined Rs. 25/- for every half an hour.

- Students willing to attend the computer classes in the evening outside the college campus must get a letter from their parents stating that the college is not responsible for their ward's behavior and for whatever happens to them during that period. On such days, they have to make their own arrangements for the dinner, as the mess closes at 8.30 pm.
- For the purpose of laundry, only dhobis authorized by the college should be utilized.
- Students should avoid wasting food, water and electricity.
- Unauthorized electrical fittings and gadgets should not be used in the hostel room.
- Students should refrain from antisocial and undesirable activities such as consumption of alcohol, tobacco, gambling, ragging and playing cards etc.
- Students should not enter the hostel during college working hours or allow their day scholar friends inside their rooms. Students are instructed to adhere to the study timings, mess timings and telephone timings.
- Attendance will be taken during the study hours.
- If any student found absent three days continuously will be dealt seriously; if it continues parents will be called for. Students who do not pay hostel dues or found guilty of misbehavior or bad conduct will be expelled from the hostel.
- Outside food is not allowed inside the hostel.
- Possession/Usage of MOBILE, WALKMAN, IPOD, CAMERA, & other Electronic items are not allowed in hostel. If found the same will be seized & will not be returned. The student will be expelled immediately, without any enquiry.
- Students who fail to report on the re-opening day, or after long holidays, should pay a hostel readmission fee of Rs.500/-. Leave message will not be accepted.
- Continuation of hostel stay by the student depends on his/her performance

SYSTEM OF EXAMINATION

Performance in each course of study shall be evaluated based on

- i. Continuous internal assessment throughout the semester and
- ii. A university examination at the end of the semester.

Each course, both theory and practical shall be evaluated for a maximum of 100 marks. For all theory and practical courses the continuous internal assessment will carry 20 marks while the university examination will carry 80 marks. The Internal marks will be awarded to the students purely based on their performance in each of the internal examinations and their attendance & conduct in regular classes. The university examination (both theory and practical) will be conducted between November - December for odd semester and April – May for even semester respectively.

At present, the Anna University is awarding the grades and for details please see <u>www.annauniv.edu</u>.

Students indulging in malpractice will be sent out from the examination hall and disciplinary action will be initiated against them.

If the students lose their hall ticket means, duplicate hall ticket can be obtained with the payment of Rs. 50/-

PASSING REQUIREMENTS

A candidate, who secures not less than 50% of total marks prescribed for the courses with minimum of 45% of the marks prescribed for the 'end semester university examination' in both theory and practical examination, shall be declared as passed in the examination.

If a candidate fails to secure a pass mark in a particular course, it is mandatory that he/she shall register and reappear for the examination in that course during the next semester. He / She should continue to register and reappear for the university examination until he/she secures a pass mark.

For Internal exams, minimum passing mark is 70%.



Rules & Regulations for Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging

The All India Council For Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi vide its Notification no. 37-3/Legal/AICTE/2009 dated 25-03-2009 has taken a very serious view of ragging incidences in educational institutions and on Directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its Order dated 16.5.2007 has ordered strict implementation of following rules & regulations for prevention and prohibition of Ragging in technical Institutions.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court has, inter-alia, mentioned the following types of ragging:-

1. Ragging has several aspects with, among others, psychological, social, political, economic, cultural, and academic dimensions.

2. Any act that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student should be considered within the academics related aspect of ragging; similarly, exploiting the services of a junior student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of seniors is also an aspect of academics related ragging prevalent in many institutions, particularly in the technical institutions.

3. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a junior student by senior students should be considered an aspect of ragging for bragging economic dimensions.

4. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestured, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health of person can be put in the category of ragging with criminal dimensions.

5. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, snail-mails, blogs, public insults should be considered within the psychological aspects of ragging. This aspect would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to others; the absence of preparing 'fresher's in the run up to their admission to higher education and life in hostels also can be ascribed as a psychological aspect of ragging – coping skills in interaction with seniors or strangers can be imparted by parents as well. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of students also can be described in terms of the psychological aspects of ragging.

6. The human rights perspective of ragging involves the injury caused to the fundamental right to human dignity through humiliation heaped on junior students by seniors; often resulting in the extreme step of suicide by the victims.

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN AGAINST STUDENTS FOR INDULGING AND ABETTING IN RAGGING

1. The punishment to be meted out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents. The students who are found to be indulged in ragging should be debarred from taking admission in any technical institution in India.

2. Every single incident of ragging will lead to file a First Information Report (FIR) by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities without any delay.

3. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following.

(i) Cancellation of admission /Suspension from attending classes.

(ii) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.

(iii) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.

(iv) Withholding results.

(v) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.

(vi) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.

(vii) Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters.

(viii) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.

(ix) Fine of Rupees 25,000/-

(x) Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

4. The institutional authority shall intimate the incidents of ragging occurred in their premises along with actions taken to the Council immediately after occurrence of such incident and inform the status of the case from time to time.

5. Courts should make an effort to ensure that cases involving ragging are taken up on priority basis to send the correct message that ragging is not only to be discouraged but also to be dealt with sternness.
