Achieving a perfect 94.1% pass rate in the last year is commendable, showcasing students' dedication and proficiency.

Placement officer summarizes the placement details in meeting.</p> <p>Placement training was given to the second and third year students through Innovation Technologies.</p> <p>Placement officer explained about various initiatives taken through placement cell.</p> <p>Students need to be motivated to take up higher studies.</p>	<p>Although the placement statistics for 2023-24 are promising, there is still potential for growth. The commendable participation of 45 companies and the successful placement of 182 students are noteworthy. As a result of comprehensive placement training encompassing soft skills, aptitude, and technical training from the first year, our institute has achieved a placement rate of 94%. 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











